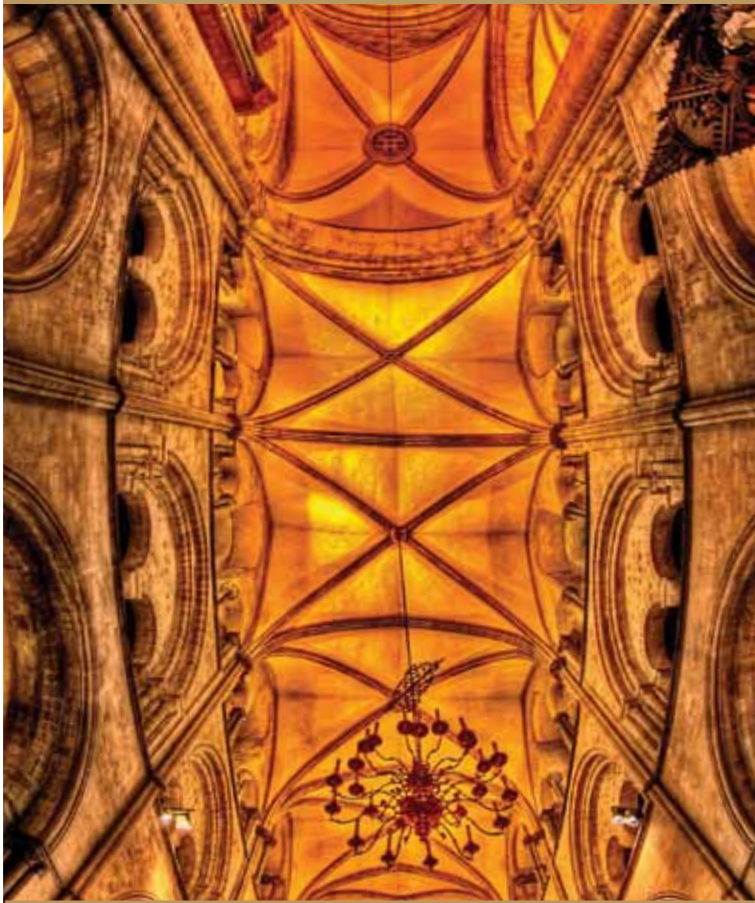




CHICHESTER CATHEDRAL Events
