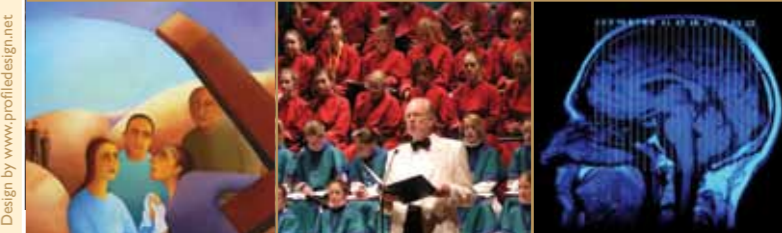

#### 'Spiritual Cinema' Sunday 7 March to Sunday 25 April.

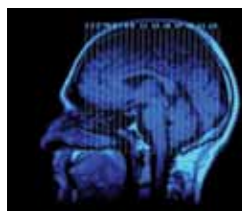
