**Spire of Peace,** 5<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> November. This November the Cathedral will be home to the Spire of Peace to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of the First World War and inspire us to consider how to take positive action for peace. The Spire of Peace has been designed by land artists Mark and Rebecca Ford to stand eight metres high in the North Transept. The Spire of Peace will also be the focus for events for young people from West Sussex Young Carers group as well as local primary schools at the INSPIRE School Friends Service on the 9<sup>th</sup> November. Chichester Quakers will hold a vigil for peace to remember all those including civilians who have died in war. A white poppy wreath to symbolise hope for peace without further violence will be laid. All are welcome.

**Remembering World War I:** The Cathedral will be holding a special Service of Remembrance and Reconciliation on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> November at 3.30pm, with guest preacher the Rt Revd Dr Martin Warner, Bishop of Chichester. Commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the World War One Armistice, this service aims to bring together the people of Chichester to recall the great sacrifice made by millions of soldiers and civilians from 1914-18, including many serving in the Royal Sussex Regiment (whose names are recorded on the walls of St George's Chapel in the

Cathedral). The service will also focus on the themes of regret, recognition of our common humanity, and finally reconciling ourselves to working towards a better future. All are welcome to attend this service, which will be accompanied by readings, poetry and music from the Cathedral Choir. Attendees are requested to be seated by 3.15pm.
