Remembering World War I: The Cathedral will be holding a special Service of Remembrance and Reconciliation today at 3.30pm, with the Rt Revd Dr Martin Warner, Bishop of Chichester as preacher. Commemorating the 100th anniversary of the World War One Armistice, this service will recall the great sacrifice made by millions of soldiers and civilians, including many serving in the Royal Sussex Regiment (whose names are recorded on the walls of St George's Chapel in the Cathedral). The service will also focus on the themes of regret, recognition of our common humanity, and finally reconciling ourselves to working towards a better future. All are welcome to attend this service, which will be accompanied by readings, poetry and music from the Cathedral Choir. Please be seated by 3.15pm.
