NEW DEAN OF PORTSMOUTH

The Bishop of Portsmouth has announced that the new Dean of Portsmouth will be Canon Dr Anthony Cane, currently our Chancellor at Chichester Cathedral.

Anthony has served here at Chichester since 2007 and has led a transformation of the Cathedral's work in the areas of education, the arts, visitor engagement, and external partnerships. His priorities as the new Dean of Portsmouth, the most senior cleric at Portsmouth Cathedral, will include securing its long-term sustainability, developing congregation numbers and sharpening its strategic focus.

Anthony said of his new post: "I am thrilled to be joining the Cathedral and diocese as Dean of Portsmouth. What a privilege to have the chance to live and pray at the heart of a vibrant, diverse city and diocese. I look forward to working closely with the Bishop, Cathedral staff, worshipping community and volunteers, in furthering the ministry of the Cathedral as a sign of God's deep compassion and grace for every corner of the city and diocese. While there are challenges to face, the Cathedral is well placed to go from strength to strength, and I am excited to be arriving at this point in its history."

The Bishop of Chichester, the Right Reverend Dr Martin Warner, said: "Anthony Cane is one of the most imaginative theological communicators in the Diocese of Chichester. He brings an enquiring mind to a praying heart, and relates them to his experience of the world around him. Anthony will be greatly missed by the Cathedral congregation and community in Chichester. We are delighted that he is moving to our neighbouring Diocese of Portsmouth and we assure him, and his wife, Clare, of our prayers and very best wishes for the future."

The Dean of Chichester, the Very Reverend Stephen Waine said: "Chichester Cathedral has benefitted greatly from Anthony Cane's ministry as Canon Chancellor. His gift for theological enquiry has enriched our life, and his joyful capacity for hard work and his enthusiasm for the Cathedral's ministry in Chichester and throughout the diocese have been much appreciated. Anthony and Clare will be missed by the Cathedral community.

"We are pleased that they are moving 'next door' and we wish them well and assure them of our prayers for their move and for ministry in the Cathedral, city and Diocese of Portsmouth."

Anthony will be installed as Dean of Portsmouth on Saturday 16th March.

Chichester Cathedral Chapter Summary: October / November

In October Chapter visited Old Alresford Place and spent its awayday planning how to evolve further towards the model of governance and strategic leadership outlined in the Cathedrals Working Group Report, supported by the Cathedral's Executive Board which should be responsible for operational management.

At November's Chapter meeting the Fundraising team from the Cathedral's Restoration and Development Trust presented their strategy for the coming years. This is designed to deliver both capital and revenue fundraising for the Cathedral with the key targets being the remaining funds required for the cathedrals reroofing project and their commitment to provide support for music and learning and engagement activity. Chapter agreed to start a fundraising group to make sure that the various areas involved in fundraising can work together.

Chapter considered recommendations for the re-development of the Treasury Building, which is currently occupied downstairs by the Finance Team (and sometimes the Cathedral Friends), with the upstairs vacant. It endorsed the recommendation to seek to create apartment-hotel rooms for short term rental, which also offered the flexible alternative of longer-term tenancies. A timeline for the work will now be developed.

The Head of Finance presented an analysis of the Cathedral's investment portfolio, including property, to enable Chapter to consider the areas which are performing less well and where it might generate further income to support the Cathedral in its mission. The briefing also informed a discussion about how the Treasury project could best be funded.
