Musical news: It has just been announced that Edmund Aldhouse, former organ scholar at Chichester Cathedral (2001-02) has been appointed as the new Director of Music at Ely Cathedral. We congratulate him on his success! You may also be interested to know that David Soar (organ scholar 1995-96) has gone on to make his career in singing, rather than organ, and has had solo roles at Glyndebourne in recent years. In June he will perform as one of the soloists at the annual Handel Festival in Halle, Germany. Similarly Ben Nicholas (organ scholar 1994-5) is now doing great things as Director of Music at Merton College, Oxford.
