Peregrine Watch: At the time of writing (Wed 3rd) there are currently two eggs in the peregrine falcon nest in the spire. You can watch their progress via a webcam accessed from the Cathedral website - it's a fascinating view! Remember, there are free Open Days when you can observe the peregrines through a telescope, watch the webcam footage, and learn more about the birds and their activities: they will be held on 27th & 28th April; 4th & 5th May; 18th & 19th May; 8th & 9th June; 15th & 16th June. All Open Days are weather permitting!

Lights Out for Earth Hour: The lights went out on the Cathedral, and across the UK, at 8.30pm on Saturday 30th March. This simple act of turning off the outside lights for an hour was a visual demonstration of the threat of accelerating climate change and biodiversity loss worldwide and endeavours to spark conversations and initiatives on the loss of nature and the urgent need to protect it. (The Cathedral is actively working towards an environmentally friendly approach, and last year was awarded Eco Church Bronze Status.)

“We are delighted to participate in this important global event: Earth Hour is a demonstration of our ongoing commitment to work towards sustainable practices across all aspects of Cathedral life,” commented the Very Reverend Stephen Waine, Dean of Chichester.
