Cathedral Peregrines' Nest Watch: Every year a pair of peregrine falcons raise new chicks in the Cathedral's spire. A series of Open Days will be held to give visitors the opportunity to observe the peregrines through a telescope, watch the live webcam footage of the nesting site from the café, and learn more about the birds and their activities.
