We are celebrating double recognition at the 21st annual Sussex Heritage Awards. At the Awards Ceremony on Wednesday 3rd July, traditional lead worker John Hill, along with his sons Lewis and Dale, were winners in the prestigious Building Crafts Award section for the re-covering of the Quire roof, the first phase in the overall sequence of work.

In addition, the Cathedral received Highly Commended status in the Ecclesiastical Award category for the Quire roof restoration. This recognition additionally celebrates the vital work of carpenters John Maddison and Constantin Nistok who are working to repair any damaged timbers that support the new lead roof covering. The Dean of Chichester Cathedral, the Very Reverend Stephen Waine said, "All at the Cathedral are delighted that John, Dale and Lewis have received such recognition. Both awards deservedly celebrate the skills and dedication of the individual craftsmen involved in this project, and also the hard work of every member of the Restoration Team – contractors, staff and volunteers."

Roof Tour – An exclusive invitation to view the Cathedral roof project. Members of the Cathedral congregation are invited to join Ali George, Head of Fundraising and Tony Allen, Clerk of Works for a tour to see the restoration, repairs and re-covering of the Cathedral's North and South Transept roofs.

Chichester Cathedral Trust has successfully raised £4 million towards the £5.8 million total project cost. This has enabled the work to be completed on the Quire and Presbytery roofs and the current work on the Transept roofs and Lantern. Fundraising continues to secure the remaining funds needed for the Nave roof, which is expected to commence towards the end of this year.

The two hour tour will commence with a briefing and introduction at ground level before guests commence the climb of 100 steps up ten open-tread staircases on the scaffolding to reach the roofs. Please consider your level of fitness before signing up for this tour.
