**Restoration: Graham Sutherland Painting.** Over the summer, our Graham Sutherland Painting *Noli Me Tangere* was restored by experts at Pallant House Gallery. The original underwent restoration on the frame which was adapted and recovered, and which now incorporates 4.4mm laminated gallery standard non-reflective glass and backing to offer better protection. The replacement velour is very slightly lighter than the original – the framer advised how he had obtained numerous swatches to find the best match possible but was still unable to find exactly the right one – but it certainly shows off the colourful painting very well and sits well against the slightly darker stonework behind. The original colour of the velvet was, as expected, quite different to the fabric discoloured over time that you may recall from the old frame. The restoration was completed and the painting returned to its location on 19<sup>th</sup> August.
