The Strauss Family is inextricably linked with nineteenth century Vienna and Viennese society and the popularisation of the waltz. Johann Strauss the younger is known as the 'Waltz King' for very good reason but he also had a sizeable output of Marches, Polkas and even operettas including the ever popular 'Die Fledermaus'.
