Annual Review: The latest Cathedral Annual Review for 2018-19 has just been published. It describes in an accessible, insightful and pictorial manner something of the last year of our common life together. Cathedral Chapels Book: On Wednesday 25th September a new book, *Chichester Cathedral: The Chapels: History and Response* was launched. This is the final volume in the series of Otter Memorial Papers, which began in 1978 and represent a collaboration between the Cathedral and the University, with Paul Foster as Editor until his death in 2015. The book contains essays and studies on all the chapels, from a general overview by Michael Gudgeon to individual reflections from scholars, students and members of the congregation, and provides a fascinating account of the development of the Cathedral and its devotional use. The book has been most generously funded by the Friends of Chichester Cathedral. Copies of the book are on sale today in the South Transept after the Eucharist at the discounted price of £10.
