Pallant House Gallery is holding a fascinating free Exhibition revealing the important relationship between Henry Moore and his patron Walter Hussey (former Dean of Chichester). The Exhibition runs Wednesday 30th October until Sunday 8th March. This is their first exhibition exploring Hussey's patronage of Henry Moore, and reveals the important relationship between the two men. It captures key moments in Henry Moore's career including his Surrealist drawings, his drawings of wartime shelters and mines in the pits of Yorkshire; his 1940s lithographs and his late work including the magnificent and mysterious Elephant Skull album (1970). Through the display of other works bequeathed by various collectors, the exhibition will provide an insight into how Moore was collected and supported in the 20th century.

Be Still: The next meetings of the Chichester Contemplative Prayer Group, that explores silent prayer in the Christian tradition, are on Tuesday 5th and 19th November (7.15pm for 7.30pm start, finishing 8.45pm) in 4 Canon Lane. The specific focus for the evenings will be *Prayer short and pure* (5th) and *Be Still* (19th).

Ships of Heaven: Wednesday 6th November, 6.30pm, Vicars' Hall, Chichester Cathedral. Join us to hear Christopher Somerville, the walking correspondence of the Times, talk about his new book 'The Ships of Heaven - The Private Life of Britain's Cathedrals'.

Ships of Heaven is the story of Britain's flotilla of cathedrals, tossed on waves of power and glory, scandal and mayhem for a thousand years. Nowadays these great stone ships seem as solid and unshakeable as any Rock of Ages. But they are leaky old vessels in uncharted waters. They creak and groan, they fail and founder, then resurface against all odds. Theirs is a thrilling saga of crisis and boldness, of ruin and revival. Christopher Somerville explores 20 of his favourite cathedrals, going behind the scenes to seek out believers, non-believers and troubled souls, archaeologists and architects, glass makers and embroiderers, the Holy Dusters who clean the ears and noses of the cathedral monuments, and the stonemason who judges his building stone by the way it tastes. It's a journey with a motley crew of jolly rogues and prophets, of builders and bishops; painters dangling at a rope's end, monks who watch as their life's work comes crashing down before their eyes. In such colourful company we delve deep into the private life and the uncertain future of these ever-voyaging Ships of Heaven. (Published by Doubleday, 11 April 2019).
