**David Hopkinson CBE:** There will be a special Choral Evensong on Tuesday November 26<sup>th</sup> at 5.30pm in thanksgiving for the life of David Hopkinson. The contribution David has made to the life of the Cathedral, the Diocese and in wider public life is exceptional even in an age in which hyperbole is normative. David was a founder member of Chichester Cathedral Restoration and Development Trust and a founder donor of the Millennium Trust, which have provided huge sums of money for the preservation of the fabric of the Cathedral over many years.

David was also passionate about the music and worship of the Cathedral and through his vision an organ fund was created; he himself provided the nave division of the organ, which is known as the Poling Organ in recognition of the place where David lived. He was a generous patron of the Southern Cathedrals Festival and a wise member of the Cathedral Finance Committee. For many years he was Chairman of the Diocesan Board of Finance and transformed the finances of the diocese for good as well as contributing to the life of the national church in his role as a Church Commissioner.

But his work also extended well beyond the church. Early in his career he was Clerk to the House of Commons; he served on the Bank of England Advisory Committee and he spent nine years as a highly successful Managing Director of M and G investment house. More locally he served as Chair of Pallant House Art Gallery and was a Deputy Lord Lieutenant. The University of Chichester bestowed on him an honorary degree in recognition of the contribution he made to life in Sussex. All are welcome to join us for Evensong on November 26<sup>th</sup> as we give thanks with his family and friends for a life well lived. **Chichester Food Bank Christmas Update:** Due to the roll out of Universal Credit in this area the number of people using our foodbank has risen by 30% since April. This means for the first time we have severe shortages of certain items. Most urgently needed are: tinned meat\*, jam, tea bags, smash and tinned soup\*. Please help! Toiletries, toilet rolls packed in twos and fours and tin openers are also really appreciated. (\*Tins with ring pulls to open are best.)

You may be interested to know that when we started the main reason people used the foodbank was delays to benefit payments. That now runs second to people in work on low wages, zero hours contracts and jobs being cut down to part-time work. Living in an area where rents are high and transport very expensive, people easily accumulate debt and now eviction rates are rising - which is devastating for families with children.

As always a huge thank you for your continued generosity as Christmas is looking bleak for many families we see. *(Marguerite Saffery)*

**Handel's Messiah.** Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> December at 7.15pm in the Nave. After an inspiring performance of Bach's *Magnificat* in 2018, Charles Harrison - Organist and Master of the Choristers, Chichester Cathedral - once again directs the professional singers *NMH* and the period ensemble *three parts vied* in an intimate performance of Handel's *Messiah*. Using small, perfectly balanced forces, hear this much-loved masterpiece come to life in this beautiful setting. Proceeds to support the work and ministry of the Cathedral. Tickets cost  $\pounds 20$  (or  $\pounds 16$  with restricted view) and are available at the Cathedral Shop or via the Cathedral website.

**Chichester Cathedral: The Chapels, History and Response**, ed. Paul Foster and Rachel Moriarty (University of Chichester 2019), was launched in September; the first print has almost sold out and a reprint is now available. This is the last (no 36) of Paul Foster's Otter Memorial Papers, which have described and interpreted aspects of the Cathedral and its neighbourhood from 1987 until his death in 2014. This one covers the Chapels in a series of engaging and scholarly chapters by people familiar in the Cathedral community, including Colin Clark, Tim Schofield, John Hind, Sarah Quail, Alan Readman, John Wyatt and others.
