Canon Tim Schofield is to retire this summer after 14 years as Residentiary Canon and Precentor here. His last service will be the 11.00am Sung Eucharist on Sunday 7th June. It will be followed by a reception in the South Transept when we will thank Tim and Julie for their great contribution to the Cathedral over the past 14 years and wish them well for the future. Members of the congregation will want to express their gratitude to Tim and Julie for their ministry here, and contributions towards a farewell gift to be presented on 7th June may be given to the Vergers. Please place them in an envelope marked 'Precentor's Retirement Gift.'

The Coronavirus and the Eucharist: While it is our faith that the sacraments are a means of grace and not of sickness, they are physically ministered, and we should take due care. The Diocese has issued the following guidelines which we will be following in the Cathedral.

- The presiding priest at the Eucharist will use hand sanitizer before the Preparation of the gifts of bread and wine.
- We will no longer offer the option of intinction, that is the dipping of the bread in the wine. Hands can be a source of pathogens and the dipping of the wafer into the wine can introduce germs into the cup. It can also leave traces of gluten in the wine which places those with gluten intolerance at risk. The Diocese is therefore recommending that intinction should no longer be part of our practice. If you do not wish to receive wine from the chalice, then you will receive the sacrament in one kind, that is the bread. Anglican teaching says that to receive the bread only is to receive the sacrament in its entirety.
- The Peace: If members of the congregation are concerned about a handshake then it is enough to say "peace be with you" as we turn to those around us.

Christian Aid Lent Lunches: These will be held as usual every Wednesday in Lent from 12 noon - 1.30pm at Christchurch, Old Market Avenue, Chichester, hosted by a different church each week. The Cathedral is hosting the first one, on Ash

Wednesday, (26th February), so we would love it if even more of you came and joined us for a bowl of home-made soup in aid of those in need around the world. Thank you. (Julie Schofield)

Cathedral Choir: This May, the Cathedral Choir will travel to Germany for a 5-day tour, visiting Bamberg, Königsberg, Pegnitz, Bayreuth and Stadtkirche. This takes place in the context of Chichester's long-standing friendship and ecumenical partnership with this part of Bavaria; previous choir tours have played an invaluable role in strengthening this relationship.

Choir tours are expensive! We are fortunate to have generous financial support from our German friends, and donations from members of the Cathedral community so far amount to £6600, but we still need to find £7500 to meet the remaining costs. In the coming weeks, chorister parents will be holding cake sales after Sunday Eucharists to help raise funds for the tour: you can help by purchasing some delicious baked goods to take home with you. Last chance to see a fascinating free Exhibition revealing the important relationship between Henry Moore and his patron Walter Hussey (former Dean of Chichester) has opened at Pallant House Gallery, running until Sunday 8th March. This is their first exhibition exploring Hussey's patronage of Henry Moore, and reveals the important relationship between the two men. It captures key moments in Henry Moore's career including his Surrealist drawings, his drawings of wartime shelters and mines in the pits of Yorkshire; his 1940s lithographs and his late work including the magnificent and mysterious Elephant Skull album (1970). Through the display of other works bequeathed by various collectors, the exhibition will provide an insight into how Moore was collected and supported in the 20th century.

Annual Roll Meeting: This will be in Vicars' Hall on Tuesday 28th April at 6.30pm and is a good opportunity to find out about the life of the Cathedral. Eco-friendly paper: With the start of Lent on 26th February, our orders of service will look at bit different. They will be printed on 100% recycled paper - a sustainable product made without the harsh bleach and optical brightening agents which give paper its 'gleaming white' appearance, but which are so harmful to the environment. This is all part of our efforts to watch our environmental footprint and help combat climate change.

As an organization, our use of paper is huge; according to my calculations you could build a tower 81m high, if you stacked all the reams we use in a year... that's just a few metres shy of the height of the Cathedral spire! We will still produce the 'yellows' - larger print versions of the orders of service, and the stewards will be happy to provide you with one of these if you wish.
