

Paint Out Masters 2021

FAQs

When is the event taking place?

- Week 1 (12th June, 10.00am - 2.00pm) - Adults (18+)
- Week 2 (19th June, 10.00am - 2.00pm) - Under 18s (accompanied by parent/guardian)

On both days check-in will open from 10.00am, though you can arrive later, but please be aware that the event ends at 2.00pm.

What do I do when I arrive?

- On both days there will be a registration table outside the Cathedral on West Street where you need to go to register and receive a map and further guidance;

Can I paint anywhere?

- Yes, you can use any external space within the historic Cathedral quarter – including the Cathedral Green, Cloisters, Bishop's Palace lawn and Gardens. Please make sure you are not blocking access or causing a hazard when you select a spot to position yourself. Further guidance will be issued when you arrive on the day.

Do I need to bring my own art materials?

- Week 1 – 12th June 2021: Entrants will need to bring their own materials to work with (adults; 18+);
- Week 2 – 19th June 2021: Entrants will be provided with materials on the day (children, 18 and under). If they are completing the activity from home, they will need to supply their own. There is a video on the Cathedral website to explain what materials we will be using at our workshops.

What materials can I use?

- Entries can be in any medium and on paper or canvas. Entries must be 2D and photography is only acceptable if incorporated as part of a submission i.e. collage.

Do children need to be accompanied?

- Yes, all children must be accompanied by a responsible parent/guardian when attending on the 19th June.

Do I have to go on the day, or have a ticket, to enter the competition?

- Entrants do not need to attend the event or have a ticket to enter the competition;
- Entrants can visit on an alternate day or use images provided by POM21 via the Cathedral website or social media channels to create an entry;

How do I submit my entry?

Entries will be accepted digitally on Instagram using the hast tag #POM21 or by email to office@tidyst.com with the following details:

- Name
- Title of work
- Size of work
- Medium

What is the deadline for entry?

- Midday on 25th June 2021 is the deadline for entries.

Are there toilet facilities on-site that I can use?

On-site toilet facilities can be located within the Cathedral's Cloisters. Alternatively, public toilet facilities are located opposite the Cathedral on West Street.

Is there parking?

There are no designated parking spaces available, however there are several local pay and display car parks in the vicinity. If you need assistance with access please contact lucie@Tidystartschool.com prior to the event.

Will there be refreshments available?

There are several cafes and coffee shops directly adjacent to the Cathedral and on the High Street. It is advisable to bring some refreshments, such as water, as you may not want to pack your art equipment away once you get started.
