Bernstein in Chichester Exhibition: Tuesday 2nd - Tuesday 30th October. Free entry, in the Cathedral's North Transept. Among the collections in the West Sussex Records Office are a compelling series of documents recording Leonard Bernstein's time in Chichester and the first performance of the *Chichester Psalms* in 1965. Walter Hussey, Dean of Chichester, commissioned the original work in 1963 when he wrote to Leonard Bernstein asking if he would compose a piece of choral music for the Southern Cathedrals Festival in 1965. Bernstein accepted. An extraordinary friendship arose from their correspondence, and in July 1965 the *Chichester Psalms* was performed in the Cathedral in the presence of the composer. This exhibition is part of the 'Bernstein in Chichester' festival marking the city's close ties with the legendary composer in his centenary year.

NEWS FROM CHICHESTER DISTRICT FOODBANK

The foodbank is six years old this September and the need for our food parcels continues to increase as Universal Credit is starting its roll out in this area. You may have seen the shocking statistic recently published by the Trussell Trust that during July and August in England three day food emergency food supplies were provided for 204,525 people and 74,011 went to families with children.

Our foodbank provided food boxes for children who have free school meals for the six week holiday. The children would not have had lunch as many of these families can only afford one meal a day.

The top reason for accessing the Chichester foodbank is now low income, households where there are people in work but their wages do not cover rent, increasing all the time, utility bills or food. The second is benefit delays and the third benefit changes. In this area homelessness is on the increase and people who are trying to claim Personal Disability Payments are refused in the first instance so they have to appeal. Almost all people are then granted the benefit but meanwhile they have no access to an income. We feed these people, but for some the wait is months. The Trussell Trust always aimed to give people three days worth of food until their benefits arrived but that is now impossible; we cannot let anyone starve as has occurred in other localities.

Please look at our website for food items urgently needed; the lunch boxes really depleted our stocks. Also we need shower gel, toilet rolls and deodorant. You may be interested to know that since we opened the Cathedral baskets have generated 7652.85Kg. Keep it coming!

Thank you so much for all you do to support this project. It is very much appreciated by our clients. If anyone would like to see the foodbank at work you would be very welcome, just contact me. Similarly if you have any questions. Thank you again. (Marguerite Saffery)
