**Restoration of the Chichester Reliefs:** A small, highly skilled team specialising in sculpture and architectural conservation, have been undertaking essential restoration work on the Chichester Reliefs. These two panels (located in the south Quire aisle) are considered to be amongst the finest masterpieces of Romanesque sculpture. A detailed study concluded that they were probably carved in the 12<sup>th</sup> century. The panels depict Christ being met by Martha and Mary at the Gate of Bethany, and the Raising of Lazarus from the dead. The conservation work included removing the shabby Victorian restoration work and carrying out cleaning and a sympathetic restoration as well as filling in severe cracks in the joins of the blocks. After the work is finished, the glass will be removed from the front of one of the Reliefs, so that visitors can get a closer look at this beautiful sculpture.
