MONSIGNOR PHILIPPE CHRISTORY

MONSIGNOR PHILIPPE CHRISTORY was born in 1958 in Tourcoing. An ICAM engineer and naval officer, Philippe Christory began his career in the private sector.

During a pivotal encounter in Paris and then in Paray-le-Monial, he rediscovered his faith in Jesus Christ and joined the Emmanuel Community.



Ordained a priest on 27 June 1992, for the


Archdiocese of Paris, he served in several parishes in the capital (Sainte-Trinité, Saint-Nicolas-des-Champs, Saint-Laurent). In 2004, he was seconded as parish priest to the Diocese of Fréjus-Toulon. He returned to Paris in 2007, where he remained until his appointment by Pope Francis as head of the Diocese of Chartres on February 2, 2018.

His episcopal ordination took place on 15 April 2018 at Chartres Cathedral. He is the 129th bishop of this diocese.

THE GATHERING

SERMON

INSTALLATION OF THE CANON OF HONOUR

May the God of peace sanctify you: may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before him at the coming of our Lord Jesus with his saints.


The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.


There dawns no sabbath, no sabbath is o'er, those sabbath-keepers have one and no more; one and unending is that triumph-song which to the angels and us shall belong.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER



It is indeed right and good, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Today we honour Richard, who in your loving providence enabled your Church to grow in spirit as the body of Christ.

To your children he faithfully proclaimed the good news of salvation and nourished them by ministering your sacraments.

Through a pastor's love he led your people to share your grace and witness to the world

in the communion of one true faith and in the work of selfless charity.

On this his feast, we join with him to praise you and in the company of angels and all the host of heaven we sing for ever of your glory:

The choir sings

SANCTUS

Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus Dominus Deus Sabaoth, pleni sunt caeli et terra gloria tua. Hosanna in excelsis. Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues:

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

GIVING OF COMMUNION

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

The Bishop and people receive communion. Please sit until directed by the Stewards.

Members of all Christian churches are welcome to receive communion. Please indicate if you wish to receive a gluten-free wafer. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please come to the communion station and bow your head.

After you have received communion, please try to maintain a prayerful silence.

THE SENDING OUT

HYMN

During this hymn we process to the Shrine of St Richard. Please follow the direction of the Stewards.



In our day of thanksgiving one psalm let us offer for the saints who before us have found their reward; when the shadow of death fell upon them, we sorrowed, but now we rejoice that they rest in the Lord.

In the morning of life, and at noon, and at even, he called them away from our worship below; but not till his love, at the font and the altar, had girt them with grace for the way they should go.
