THE REVEREND CANON DR EARL COLLINS



Earl Collins was a Benedictine monk before reception into the Church of England in 2018. He has taught in Rome, Ireland, the USA, India, Nigeria and Jerusalem, and for the New York Centre for Jungian Studies. He has also been Chaplain and Acting Vice-Principal at Westcott House, Cambridge.

In this diocese Earl has been Vicar of St John the Baptist, Hove, and Officer for Continuing Ministerial Development, overseeing clergy

formation and holding seminars in theology, psychology, and spirituality. As an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral he has contributed to its adult formation programmes.

Earl is civilly partnered with The Reverend James McMahon, an NHS lead chaplain for mental health. He looks forward immensely to joining the Cathedral in this new and exciting way and contributing to its liturgical, pastoral and educational mission.

THE COLLATION

The Dean presents the Chancellor designate to the Bishop, who addresses him:

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation.

Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

The Declaration of Assent is then made:

I, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

Then follow the Oaths:

- I, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, do swear by Almighty God that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles the Third, his heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.
- I, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Chichester and his successors in all things lawful and honest: So help me God.
- I, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, do swear by Almighty God that I will faithfully observe the Constitution and Statutes, ordinances and laudable customs of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity in Chichester, so far as they concern me on account of my Office or Dignity of CHANCELLOR in the same Cathedral Church.

After subscribing the Declaration and Oaths the Chancellor designate stands before the Bishop, who shall read the Deed of Collation and say

Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus who was wounded for our sins, that you may bear in your life and ministry the love and joy and peace which are the marks of Jesus in his disciples. The Spirit of God rest on you, filling you with wisdom, understanding and the fear of the Lord. The peace of Christ stand guard over your heart and mind. And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be with you always.

THE INSTALLATION

The Bishop reads the mandate for the Dean to install the new Chancellor. The Dean leads the new Chancellor to his stall as the choir sings

Behold, how good and joyful a thing it is: brethren, to dwell together in unity!

It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down unto the beard: even unto Aaron's beard, and went down to the skirts of his clothing.

Like as the dew of Hermon: which fell upon the hill of Sion. For there the Lord promised his blessing: and life for evermore. The Dean addresses the new Chancellor:

Will you promise and swear due fealty to the Cathedral, obedience to the Chapter according to the Constitution and Statutes, and will you observe the ancient customs of this Cathedral? Chancellor: I will.

The Dean presents the new Chancellor with a prayer book, a copy of the Constitution and Statutes of the Cathedral, which govern the Chapter and are symbolised by a rod or 'rule', together with a loaf of common bread symbolising the Prebend from which in the past the Prebendary obtained his daily bread, saying:

In the name and on behalf of the Chapter of this Cathedral Church, I receive and admit you, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, to be CHANCELLOR of this Cathedral Church and invest you in this Office by this Book as to Spirituals, and this Bread as to Temporals. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Being thus constituted, the new Chancellor lays hands upon a book of the Gospels from the Cathedral Library, saying:

I promise and swear upon the Holy Gospels of God that I will observe inviolate the articles proposed: So help me God and these Holy Gospels.

The Dean leads the following responses:

O Lord, save this thy servant;

All who puts his trust in thee.

Send him help from thy holy place;

All and evermore defend him.

Lord, hear our prayer;

All and let our cry come unto thee.

Almighty and everlasting God, look graciously upon thy servant EARL, and according to thy mercy lead him in the way of everlasting life; that he, desiring those things which are acceptable in thy sight, may daily proceed in all virtue and godliness of living; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

Go before us, O Lord, in all our doings with thy most gracious favour, and further us with thy continual help; that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in thee, we may glorify thy holy name, and finally by thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

Please stand. The Dean installs the new Chancellor, saying

By virtue of the mandate of the Lord Bishop, I, ROBERT EDWARD MACKENZIE DOWLER, Dean of this Cathedral Church, assign you, EARL MARTIN COLLINS, the Stall in this Quire due of old and by custom belonging to the Dignity and Office of CHANCELLOR.

The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth for evermore.

All Amen.

The new Chancellor is greeted with applause.

Remain standing as the cantor and choir sing

THE PRECES AND RESPONSES

O Lord, open thou our lips. And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.

- O sing unto the Lord a new song: sing unto the Lord, all the whole earth.
- Sing unto the Lord, and praise his Name: be telling of his salvation from day to day.
- Declare his honour unto the heathen: and his wonders unto all people.
- For the Lord is great, and cannot worthily be praised: he is more to be feared than all gods.
- As for all the gods of the heathen, they are but idols: but it is the Lord that made the heavens.
- Glory and worship are before him: power and honour are in his sanctuary.
- Ascribe unto the Lord, O ye kindreds of the people: ascribe unto the Lord worship and power.
- Ascribe unto the Lord the honour due unto his Name: bring presents, and come into his courts.

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

At the end of seven days, the word of the Lord came to me: Mortal, I have made you a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. If I say to the wicked, 'You shall surely die', and you give them no warning, and do not speak to warn the wicked from their wicked way, in order to save their life, those wicked persons shall die for their iniquity; but their blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked, and they do not turn from their wickedness, or from their wicked way, they shall die for their iniquity; but you will have saved your life. Again, if the righteous turn from their righteousness and commit iniquity, and I lay a stumbling-block before them, they shall die; because you have not warned them, they shall die for their sin, and their righteous deeds that they have done shall not be remembered; but their blood I will require at your hand. If, however, you warn the righteous not to sin, and they do not sin, they shall surely live, because they took warning; and you will have saved your life.


Please sit or kneel. The Prayers conclude with the Grace:
