Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Praise ye the Lord. The Lord's Name be praised.

On Sundays and Feast Days a **HYMN** is sung.

Sit as the choir sings THE PSALMODY

Texts for the Psalms can be found in The Book of Common Prayer, available in the quire stalls. The Psalms of the day are sung from Monday-Saturday; proper Psalms are sung on Sundays and Feast Days.

At the end of the final Psalm, stand as the choir sings the Gloria:

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Stand as the choir sings the canticle

The choir and clergy then process to the South Transept – please remain standing as they depart.

Monday to Friday

Stand as the choir and clergy process to the South Transept, where the cantor and choir sing

THE CLOSING RESPONSES

The Lord be with you. And with thy spirit.

Let us bless the Lord. Thanks be to God.

or

The Lord give us his peace. And life eternal. Amen.

or in Eastertide

Go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia, alleluia. Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia.
