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THE REVEREND VANESSA BARON



Before training as a deaconess Vanessa worked as a terminal care nurse. She has degrees in philosophy, theology and medieval history. She was among the first women to be ordained priest in 1994 and after two curacies became a school chaplain. She was chaplain and Head of RS at St Paul's Girls' School in Hammersmith before returning to work as a parish priest in Lyminster, just north of Littlehampton in 2017. She is a member of the Chichester DAC and is one of the vocations officers for the Diocese. Vanessa is married to James and they have an adult daughter, who, sadly, lives far away in County Durham.

THE REVEREND DR JACK DUNN



Jack joined the Diocese of Chichester in March 2021 as a part-time Parish Development Officer and Bishop's Adviser for Vocations. He has previously served as a House for Duty priest in Leytonstone and as a full-time incumbent in Wanstead, East London. He was the first Chaplain and Welfare Officer at Lincoln College, Oxford and served his title in the parish of Chelsea in West London after training at Ripon College, Cuddesdon. Before ordination he taught Modern British History at university and worked for an investment bank.

THE COLLATION

Please sit.

The Canons designate are presented to the Bishop.

The Bishop addresses the Canons designate:

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation.

Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

The Declaration of Assent is then made:

I, Vanessa Lillian Baron / Nicholas Roger Dunn, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

Then follow the Oaths:

- I, Vanessa Lillian Baron / Nicholas Roger Dunn, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, her heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.
- I, Vanessa Lillian Baron / Nicholas Roger Dunn, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Chichester and his successors in all things lawful and honest: So help me God.
- I, Vanessa Lillian Baron / Nicholas Roger Dunn, do swear by Almighty God that I will faithfully observe the Constitution and Statutes, ordinances and laudable customs of the Cathedral Church of Chichester, so far as they concern me on account of my Office and Dignity of Treasurer / Precentor in the same Cathedral Church.

After subscribing the Declaration and Oaths they stand before the Bishop, who shall read the Deeds of Collation and say

Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus who was wounded for our sins, that you may bear in your life and ministry the love and joy and peace which are the marks of Jesus in his disciples. The Spirit of God rest on you, filling you with wisdom, understanding and the fear of the Lord. The peace of Christ stand guard over your heart and mind. And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be with you always.

Amen.

The Bishop then directs the Dean to install the new Canons. Organ music is played as the Bishop processes to the cathedra.

THE INSTALLATION

The Dean addresses the Canons:

Will you promise and swear due fealty to the Cathedral, obedience to the Chapter according to the Constitution and Statutes, and will you observe the ancient customs of this Cathedral?

Canons: I will.

The Dean presents the new Canons with a Bible, a copy of the Constitution and Statutes of the Cathedral, which govern the Chapter and are symbolised by a rod or 'rule', together with a loaf of common bread symbolising the Prebend from which in the past the Prebendary obtained his daily bread, saying:

In the name and on behalf of the Chapter of this Cathedral Church, I receive and admit you, Vanessa Lillian Baron / Nicholas Roger Dunn, to be Canons of this Cathedral Church and invest you in this Office by this Book as to Spirituals, and this Bread as to Temporals. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Being thus constituted, the new Canons lay their hand upon a book of the Gospels from the Cathedral Library, saying:

I promise and swear upon the Holy Gospels of God that I will observe inviolate the articles proposed: So help me God and these Holy Gospels.

The Dean prays:

Almighty and everlasting God, look graciously upon these thy servants, Vanessa and Jack, and according to thy mercy lead them in the way of everlasting life; that they, desiring those things which are acceptable in thy sight, may daily proceed in all virtue and godliness of living; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Please stand. The Dean says

By virtue of the mandate of the Lord Bishop, I, Stephen John Waine, Dean of this Cathedral Church, assign you:

- Vanessa Lillian Baron, the Stall in this Quire due of old and by custom belonging to the Dignity and Office of Treasurer.
- Nicholas Roger Dunn, the Stall in this Quire due of old and by custom belonging to the Dignity and Office of Precentor.

The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth for evermore.

Amen.

The Dean leads the new Canons to their stalls as the choir sings

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON
