




Finding your way

The numbers on the map match your Explorer's journey.


The Glossary is on the back cover for those 'tricky' words you might not have come across before.



 Complete this picture of St Richard.


St Richard performed many miracles. One miracle involved a chalice (a special cup).



Glossary

Baptism A ceremony to welcome people into the Christian faith.

Baptistry The place in church where Baptisms take place.

Capstone The stone that sits on the very top of a building (in our case

the top of the spire).

Cathedra The Bishop's special chair.

Clergy A Vicar or Canon or Priest or Bishop.

Cloisters A covered walk in a cathedral.

Crozier The shepherd's crook held by a Bishop.

Font The bowl that holds the water used in Baptism

Mitre The Bishop's special hat.

Nave The central part of a church building, where the people

come to worship.

Pilgrim A person who goes on a spiritual journey or search

(pilgrimage).

Presbytery The area to the east of the Quire and where the High Altar

stands.

Pulpit A raised platform or box from where the clergy speak to the

people.

Quire The area where the choir sits.

Retroquire The area BEHIND the Quire where the Lady Chapel and the

Shrine to St Richard are.

Shrine The place where a saint is buried and people come to pray.

Symbol When something is used to stand for or represent another

idea or word.

Transept In a cross-shaped church either of the two parts forming

the arms of the cross shape, projecting at right angles from

the nave. (Hence North and South Transepts)
