Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome, teacher, 604  
3 September



In this picture a dove sits on the shoulder of St. Gregory with its beak close to his ear. It represents Gregory listening to the Holy Spirit dictating music, music that came to be known as Gregorian Chant. The scribe is so amazed by the beauty of what is being bestowed his eyes are almost popping out of his head! Modern scholarship has shown that the creation of Gregorian Chant was not simply down to Gregory but he was certainly the catalyst for the reform of worship and music in the church.

Gregory lived in a time of plague, flood and great political instability and knew all about suffering. Yet, he was inspired to collate music, not to provide an escape from the reality of the world, but to celebrate Christian hope in the face of death and destruction. One of the functions of music in worship is to point us to a greater reality beyond human contingency. So when we hear Gregorian Chant sung by the Lay Vicars at a Monday Evensong in this Cathedral we should remember the picture of Gregory and the scribe having their ears and eyes opened to the glory of the kingdom of God that cannot be shaken.
